This seder is open to all females, 7th Grade and




above! The cost is \$36 (\$42 for non-Sisterhood members, Next Dor Teens are free), which includes dinner, music, and the seder service.

RESCHEDULED! Wednesday, May 8, 9:30am



Lilith Salon




The Women of TRS Passover Cookbook: More Than Just a Cookbook!
